Key achievements to date:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *100% of children met the end of KS2 swimming standard. *100% of children have received the minimum entitlement of two hours of PE per week and over the year this included a range of athletics, dance, games, gymnastics and swimming. *100% of children from Reception to Year 6 have taken part in extended provision either through competitive events, after school clubs or additional curriculum provision. * The number of medals achieved in the Borough Swimming Gala rose from 12 in 2018 to 30 this year and the school secured 2nd place; only 1 point away from 1st place. * The number of medal winners and Super Sports representatives from the KS2 Borough Athletics matched last year's total of 15. *11 children were selected to attend the athletics Gifted and Talented club. *The school maintained the 1st place trophy in the SECAT athletics games in KS2. * The school has achieved the gold school games award. * The Physical Health and Wellbeing Team has met every month with parents and staff working closely together to raise attainment and participation in sport. *23 children were selected to attend phase 2 diving talent from an initial screening delivered in school. *Bikeability sessions took place for Reception, Year 4 and Year 6. *The Daily Mile has taken place in every year group. * The first Hinguar fun run is planned to take place in October. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Maintain the number of children meeting the end of KS2 swimming standard by Year 6. *Continue to increase parental perception of PE. * Ensure all children have access to a variety of sporting opportunities. * A greater % of children to represent the school in a level 2 competition. * To enter C team competitions to increase number of children taking part in competitive sport. * To build sustainability into before and after school clubs. * To replenish sports equipment, including swimming equipment. * To develop further links with external clubs and agencies. * To continue to build fitness levels across the school. * To ensure equality in sport. * To celebrate our schools achievement over the academic year. * To encourage participation through incentives. * To further develop engagement in the daily mile. * To further develop the role of play leaders and sports leaders to encourage physical activity at play times. * To purchase resources to enable play leaders and sports leaders to support physical activity at play times. * To continue to raise awareness of the importance of ABC's.

<p><u>Reflection and Areas for development following this analysis of data</u></p> <p>Our commitment to providing additional swimming sessions for G&T swimmers and for low ability swimmers in KS2 has enabled us to have a 100% success rate of children leaving KS2 having met the national curriculum requirements for water safety. This is a 13% rise from last year's outcomes. Our G&T swimmers achieved a 2nd place victory in the borough swim gala and were 1 point away from 1st place. Our swim squad came 5th place the previous year.</p> <p>For 2019/20 - To continue to use sports premium provision to support G & T swimmers and also low ability swimmers in the Summer Term 2019. To continue closely monitoring swimming levels in each year group and ensure timely interventions put in place to support low ability swimmers early and to identify and support G&T swimmers.</p>
